MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Grab a cuppa for this panui (newsletter) as we attempt to celebrate 2023 and set the scene for 2024.

An increase in learner progress across the curriculum has been a highlight of 2023. This is attributed to high and consistent expectations for learning and behaviour, alongside increased support for children with additional needs. Strong partnerships with whānau and community groups, as well as a continual focus on fostering a culture of care and empowering children to stand proudly in their culture, language and identity, have also contributed significantly to academic progress.

Some Highlights:

- Termly monitoring of student progress, enabling us to identify those who are not progressing and provide additional support.
- Extra booster groups for children with additional needs, resulting in improved learning for all.
- A growing roll, including an increase in the number of children taught in kaupapa Māori settings Rumaki and Bilingual.
- A whole school production, Taurikura, resulted in knowledge of a local legend and an opportunity for all students to communicate through dance and drama.
- Improvements to our English as a Second Language Programme (ESOL) resulting in improved instruction for these students.
- Regular school events to support home-school partnerships and to provide whānau with strategies to support learning at home.
- The introduction of an Art Specialist, supporting students to develop their artistic skills.
- Staff engage in professional learning around teacher actions that support student progress, resulting in a common understanding of high yield strategies that maximise learning.

- An increase in cultural groups and celebrations, including the addition of Filipino language evenings, a Samoan language group and hosting the local Kapa Haka Festival Ra Whakangahau, resulting in children feeling increasingly connected and proud of their culture.
- Further connections with our local community including iwi, Early Childhood Centres and Colleges.
- Further enhancement of our school grounds including an exterior repaint, new carpet and wall coverings.
- Participation in After School Sports remains high, along with an increase in opportunities for students to participate in physical activity during the school day.

Forward Focus - What's new in 2024?

In 2024 we will continue to have three syndicates:

- Taumata -Ōhane Y0-3 English Medium
- Karewa Y4-6 English Medium
- Kopurererua Māori Medium Rumaki and Bilingual

Karewa - Year 4-6 - English Medium

Next year, the Karewa team will be made up of four classes, each being a composite of Year 4, 5 and 6 children. These classes have been carefully crafted, considering learning needs, student combinations and social and emotional considerations. We are confident that this change is in the best interests of all our children and will maximise their learning and well-being. Teachers will continue to teach according to students' academic and social needs, irrespective of their year level. These composite classes will naturally facilitate the extension of younger children and additional support for older children who require it. A key focus will be growing leaders in Year 6 but also throughout this syndicate, so capability is developed. This change will also further align ourselves to the nationwide New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) Refresh which clusters learning in two groups: Y0-3 and Y4-6. Bilingual Pathway

In response to demand, we have added an additional Year 5/6 Bilingual class. A clear, fluid pathway now exists for whānau choosing a bilingual pathway for their tamariki.

More Specialist Teaching

In 2024, we will continue to provide specialist Art classes for all children as part of their termly programme. Additionally, based on the learning theme for each term, we will also provide specialised teaching in the following areas: Music, Digital Technology, and Science.

More Health and PE

We know our children thrive in outdoor settings and enjoy engaging in physical activities. We are also grateful to have a gully space on our school grounds. Next year, you can expect to see our gully further utilised as part of our daily programme. This resource will be used deliberately to support our tamariki to stay active and to learn about maintaining a healthy lifestyle and contributing to a healthier planet.
