It is hard to believe we are already entering week 8 of the term. Our tamariki (children) continue to experience settled learning environments, soaking up rich learning across the curriculum. Thank you to the 85%+ of parents who were able to attend our recent Learner Led Conferences. Your involvement means so much to us and to your tamariki!

School attendance is definitely improving, and we regularly celebrate our goal of 90%! However, we still have some work to do. In Term 1, only 50% of our children attended school for 90% of the time. Every day matters. One day absent per fortnight equals four weeks absent per year! Absences impact well-being and achievement.
