It has been a challenging experience as I scrutinise other school models and evaluate our own. What has become clear so far is that New Zealand is a leader in developing the whole child within a culturally responsive environment. However, it is also evident that we need to strengthen our ability to measure the quality and impact of programmes that develop fundamental literacy and numeracy skills.

The tour is led by Jeremy Kedian, an education consultant , who skillfully supports me and my principal colleagues to reflect on the effectiveness of our schools. Already, this experience has been pivotal in my leadership journey, providing clarity on how to pave the best path forward for our tamariki. It is indeed a privilege to be working *on* the school, rather than *in* it at this time—a privilege I am confident will benefit our school's future.
