STRENGTHENING OUR FOCUS ON CHARACTER

June 2025

Our Annual Plan focuses on three key areas: Competence, Character, and Culture. Here's what we've been doing so far to strengthen CHARACTER:

Positive Culture for Learning

Our weekly Positive Culture for Learning lessons are now a feature of school assemblies, with House Leaders creating videos that promote positive behaviours and showcase our tamariki. We've also introduced new initiatives to help students develop emotional regulation skills, including the Break Café. It's making a difference—Observable Behaviour Record (OBR) data shows a decrease in both Major and Minor incidents, meaning more quality learning time.









Building Learning-Focused Relationships with Whānau

We've run a range of events to strengthen partnerships with whānau, including:

- Together We Learn -supporting reading and maths (15 May) -70% attendance
- Meet the Teacher Evening (20 February) 90% attendance
- Cyber Safety Presentation (11 March) 15% attendance
- Before School English Club (twice weekly) several families attend every week

Onboarding HERO

We've made a great start using our new Student Management System, HERO. Staff are already using it effectively for:

- Marking attendance
- Daily notices for staff and students
- · Recording key pastoral information and behaviour incidents
- · Sharing learning updates with whānau

More features are coming, and we'll be seeking community feedback soon to help us keep improving how we use HERO together.









Introducing Cohort Entry - New Entrants

We've set up clear systems to support cohort entry for new entrants, including a pre-visit programme and published intake dates on our website. We'll keep reviewing and refining the process to ensure our learners get the best possible start.

High Expectations for Progress in Reading, Writing

We have robust systems in place to monitor student progress and provide targeted support where it's needed most. This includes the use of Learning Assistants in classrooms and specialist interventions in maths and reading. A key priority for us is to further strengthen everyday classroom practice. We're doing this through a coaching approach, focused on building teacher capability and consistency. High-quality teaching is the driver of strong, equitable progress for every ākonga.

Next term, we'll share our updates on the **Culture** area.
